## ATTITUDE TO READING SURVEYS



Pupils in classes P3 through to P7 participated in an online survey about their attitude to reading.

- 35% of our pupils like reading very much,
- 34% like reading quite a lot,
- 28% like reading a bit,
- 3% do not like reading.

This is encouraging however we want to help all pupils improve their reading habits, find enjoyment in reading and know how to find enjoyable reading material.

We will be using the results of our survey to help us make reading fun for specific groups.
