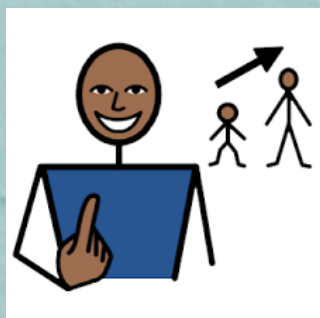


Article of the Month - April
